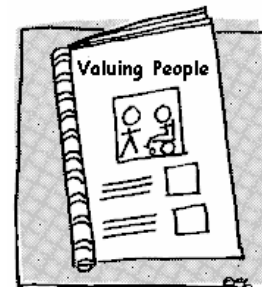

- A full version, with details of resources, for implementation groups. (*reference 26212*)



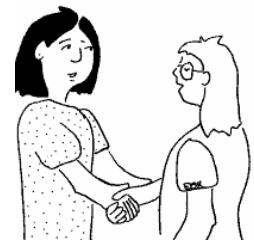

This includes an 'All means all' paper to help Social Services and Housing Managers work together so that people with learning disabilities are included in plans for housing.

This was to help people who had to write plans for staff in learning disability services. The 'workforce and training plans' should mean that there are enough staff with the right skills. It should also make sure that staff in services, like the health service, the police, and housing will be able to give a good service to people with learning disabilities.

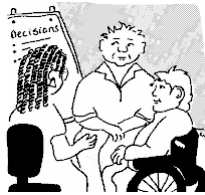

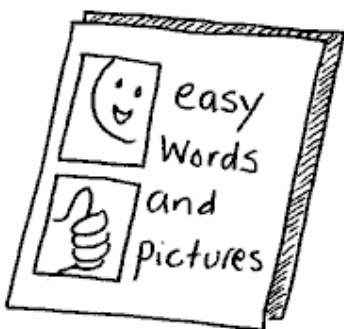
